BMW Announces the Release of the i3 EV

BMW, recently, announced that U.S. sales of their all-electric i3 EV will begin in April 2014, at a starting price of \$42,350. That's not counting destination charge, or a \$7,500 federal tax credit. They will also offer an onboard "range extender" to recharge the battery, a two-cylinder gasoline engine. That version starts at \$45,200.
