## EV NEWS

### Porsche Calling for an Immediate Pause in the Use of 785 Vehicles

This morning (February 5<sup>th</sup>), the German automaker said it would tell all 785 owners worldwide of the 2014 edition of the 911 GT3 to park their 475-hp sports cars immediately and wait for a hauler to take them to the nearest dealership. That order comes after reports of five 911 GT3s catching fire in Europe. Editorial Comment: Did anybody read or see or hear about this?

## EV NEWS (CONT.)

### Plug-in Sales in the US:

Through January of this year, approximately 174,000 plug-in vehicles have been sold in the US according to the Electric Drive Transportation Association. On a per capita basis, the five largest EV states were: Washington (1.6), Hawaii (1.5), California (1.4), Georgia (1.1) and Oregon (1.1). The five largest EV cities are San Francisco, Los Angeles, New York, Seattle and Atlanta. These cities make up 52% of EV sales.

## UPDATE ON NEW CHARGING STATIONS IN THE NORTH BAY

### New Charging Stations in the North Bay:

- (1) Fast Charger (CHAdeMO) + (1) Level II at Sunspeed Enterprises, 4<sup>th</sup> & B St, Point Reyes Station
- (2) Fast Charger (CHAdeMO) at the United Markets\*, 515 3<sup>rd</sup> St in San Rafael (Blink Network)

\*Note that this is the United Markets just east of Hwy 101 in central San Rafael. There is another fast charger at the United Markets in San Anselmo

- (2) Fast Charger (CHAdeMO) at the Northgate Mall, 5800 Northgate Dr in San Rafael (eVgo Network)
